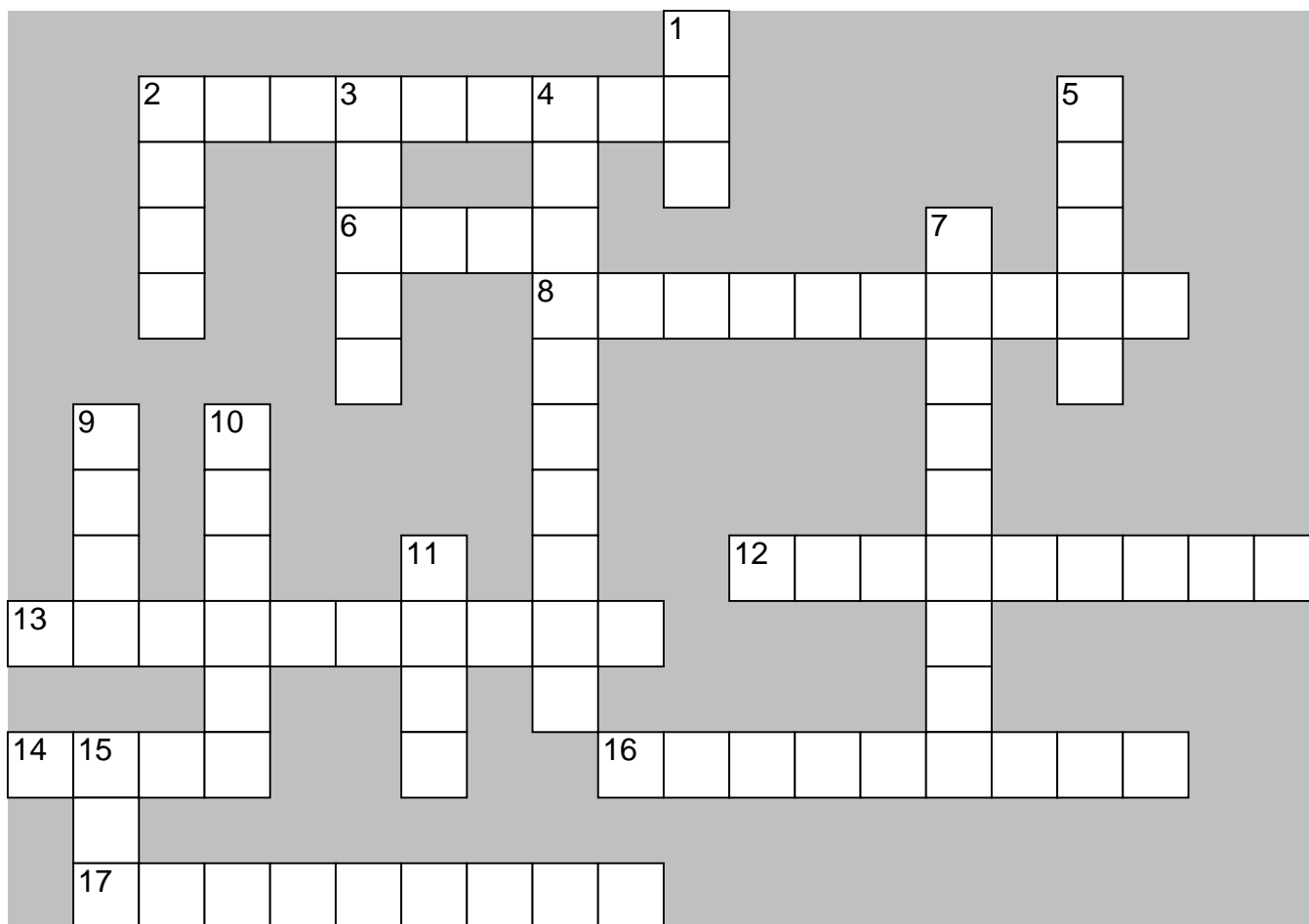


# Station 9 - Immigration
