main points of the Treaty of Versailles

information or ideas
intended to
persuade people to
believe something

an agreement between
nations to help each other

an agreement to stop
fighting while a
peace treaty is
negotiated

to approve or accept

when a nation refuses
to get involved with
other nations

money to pay for damages
caused by a war

when a strong nation uses
its power to control
weaker nations

basic or underlying things
that, over time, create
bad feelings between
people, groups, or nations

the building up of a
strong army and navy in
preparation for war

intense feelings of
pride and loyalty
toward one's country

Archduke of Austria-
Hungary in 1914;
his assassination by a

Serbian was
the immediate cause of
World War I

not taking sides

a policy of using
submarines to sink any
ships in a war zone
without warning

an attempt by Germany
to make a secret alliance
with Mexico against the
United States

Great Britain,
France,
Russia,
and others
(eventually the U.S.)

Germany,
Austria-Hungary,
the Ottoman Empire,
and others

Woodrow Wilson's
plan for peace
after World War I

the document that
formally ended
World War I for most
of the countries involved

“association of nations”
created as part of the
Treaty of Versailles
to help keep peace
in the world

1. Germany was forced to accept all blame for the war
2. Germany had to pay *reparations* to the Allies
3. Germany's colonies were taken away
4. Germany was forced to *disarm*
5. a League of Nations was created
